INFLIGHT ENTERTAINMENT

In 2004, Air Canada became the first airline in the world to adopt a new standard for inflight entertainment, by providing all customers with digital quality personal seatback entertainment on board all its aircraft, including narrow body aircraft on shorter flights.

In April, 2009, Air Canada became the first Canadian airline to make its inflight entertainment available from gate to gate. Passengers can now enjoy their entertainment selections from the moment they board the aircraft until the moment they leave.

Air Canada's inflight entertainment features:

- Seatback on-demand audio and video providing customers with over 300 hours of frequently updated entertainment choices
- Interactive moving map with flight path information
- Touch screen controls
- Pause, rewind and fast forward functionality. See what you want, when you want
- Large personal screens in main cabin (9"); (12") screens for premium class passengers
- State-of-the-art widescreen displays
- Digital quality sound and image
- Multi-lingual capability, offering movies in up to eight languages
- Single-prong outlets allowing customers to use their own headsets

Air Canada also offers all of its customers on all flights access to standard 110V electrical outlets at arm's reach.

MOVIES / TV

- Library of 30+ movies for domestic and 48 movies for international flights; 60 movies for international flights as of November 09
- Movie programming which includes Hollywood movies, classics, art house films, Canadian, children's and foreign films
- 100 hours of TV shows, including sitcoms, critically acclaimed dramas and documentaries, lifestyles shows and programs for kids
- Specialty programming from HBO, CBC, W Network, YTV/ Treehouse, Movieola- The Short Film Channel, Silver Screen Classics and more

MUSIC

- 100 CDs, from a broad spectrum of genres – with an audio player feature that allows passengers to create their own personal play list
- 12 XM satellite radio channels

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CHILDREN'S PROGRAMMING

- Movies/TV
 - at least two feature films for children each month
 - over eight hours of children's programming supplied by YTV/ Treehouse channels.
 - programs include The Adrenaline Project, Prank Patrol, Rollbots, 4 Square, Harry and His Bucket Full of Dinosaurs, Max and Ruby, and Miss Spider
- Music:
 - a Kids channel on the audio system, offering complete CDs of music for children
